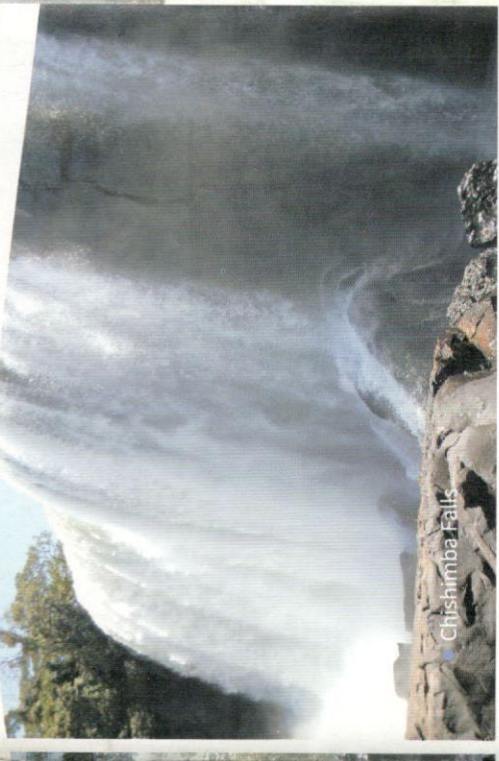

# CHISHIMBA FALLS



Chishimba Falls is a National Monument covering a total of 1,330 hectares is dissected by the Luombe River on which three waterfalls are found.

located approximately 10°06'31.40" S and 30°55'01.41" E, at an average elevation of 1,330m (4,363ft) above sea level. The site is only 35 km from Kasama town on the Kasama-Mokoso road in Kasama district of Northern Province, Zambia.

Chishimba Falls ranks as a number one heritage/tourist site in the Northern Region of NHCC; attracting thousands of tourists and contributing substantially to the national tourism industry.

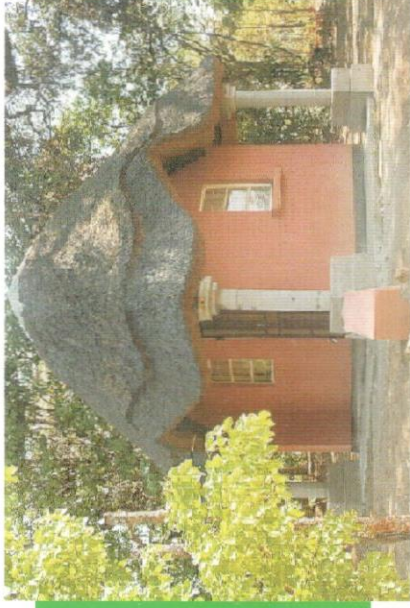
Due to the geomorphological formation of the area, the site provides an ideal terrain for Hydro Electricity Power generation, and thus it hosts a mini-hydro power station owned by the Zambia Electricity Supply Corporation (ZESCO).

Chishimba Falls in particular, was declared a national monument based on the spectacular geomorphological formation of the area. The site is composed of a sequence of three (3) falls, namely: the Mutumuna, with a width of about 20m and a height of over 20m, Kayela Falls which are a series of beautiful cascades and finally the Chishimba main Falls. The Chishimba Falls has a width of over 45m and a height of about 30m. The total drop from the Mutumuna falls to the bottom of the main Chishimba falls is about 104m.

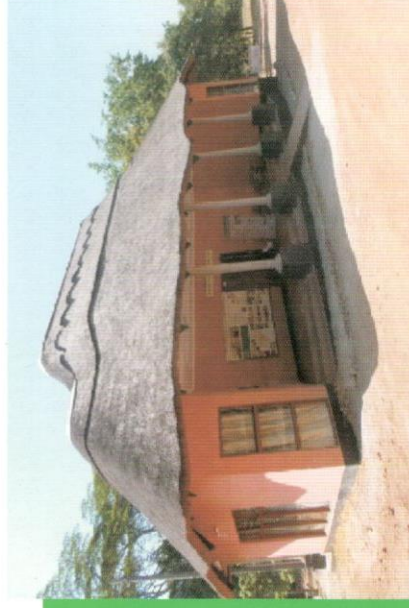

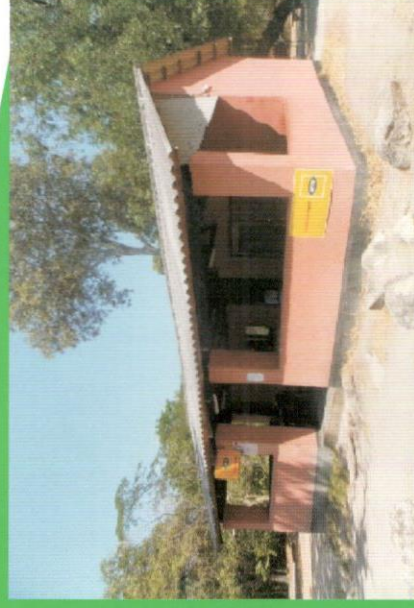

**Declaration and Management**

The National Monument site was gazetted as such under Government notice number 255 in 1964 and thus protected under National Heritage Conservation Commission (NHCC) Act, Cap 173 of the laws of Zambia. The purpose of this legislation is to conserve and protect both natural and cultural heritage, e.g. waterfalls, in perpetuity and other resources within the boundaries of the site for the benefit of the present and future generation.

**Photography/Filming**

Photography is permitted within the Falls area at no cost. However permission needs to be sought in writing if so derived photographs are to be reproduced or published. Visitors are advised to respect the privacy of owners and therefore not photograph anyone without their consent. Filming for commercial purposes is done at a fee.

**Business Hours Admission**

The Falls is open from 0600hrs to 1800hrs daily. Entry to the Falls is by payment of a statutory fee and is restricted to the access hours. Vehicle entry is also at a fee except for tour Operators' vehicles.
